Hand of the Month: 2 Club Opening

General Concepts

Bid two clubs with 21+ HCP or 8 ½ quick tricks. This bid is forcing to either 2NT (reflects 22-24 HCP) or three of a major suit. Note: do not play the two club opening bid as forcing to game since the frequency of such hands does not warrant this requirement.

Two suited hands (i.e. six spades, one heart, five diamonds, one club) should generally be opened at the one level, not two clubs. The reason is that it is extremely difficult to show both suits after opening two clubs. For one thing, another level of bidding room is used up which makes the bidding process more difficult. Another reason is if the opponents decide to preempt at a high level. For instance, an auction of two clubs, followed by an overcall of five clubs, makes for a difficult rebid by opener. It will now be almost impossible to reflect a two suited hand. Had the hand been opened with one spade, followed by five clubs, opener can now bid five diamonds reflecting a big hand with distributional values.

Responses To 2 Clubs Opener

- 1. Bid two diamonds (referred to generally as waiting or semiautomatic) unless holding a good five card major suit or a good six card minor suit. The requirement for a suit bid is disciplined (i.e. two of the top three honors in the suit, or AJ10, or KJ10 or better). Also, avoid bidding no trump; simply bid two diamonds which allows opener to describe his/her hand at the two level, and saves bidding room.
- 2. After responding, if opener bids a suit at the two level, bid three clubs holding a hand not interested in game. This bid is artificial and informs opener of a weak hand. However, remember that if opener bids three diamonds over responder's three club bid, responder must still continue bidding until three of a major suit is reached, regardless of hand quality!
- 3. Any other bid by responder after first bidding two diamonds is natural and reflects a minimum of a five card suit (denies a good suit).
- 4. Bid three diamonds as the negative response if opener rebids three clubs as a natural suit (i.e. two clubs, pass, two diamonds, pass, three clubs, pass, now bid three diamonds if holding a hand not interested in game.
- 5. Over interference by opponents at two or three level:
 - a. Pass reflects a positive hand and is game forcing
 - b. Double reflects a hand not interested in game (it is not a penalty double)
 - c. Bid a suit with proper suit requirement at the two level or three level (game forcing)

Hand Of The Month cont'd

General Comments on 2 Club Opening:

Over the years, I have played all sorts of responses to the two club opening bid. However, the two diamond waiting bid is what our partnership uses because it minimizes bidding space. It also immediately reflects a good suit (i.e. two clubs, pass, two spades), which can be extremely important to finding the proper contract.

Some of the other responses which have either been popular or are still used by players are as follows:

- 1. Two diamonds negative (0-5 HCP). Sounds good; however, the major problem is that the responder now bids a suit with unknown quality or no trump which often leads to problems in bidding and play of the hand.
- 2. Step responses (various styles, including two or three point ranges). Major problem is that bidding space is used by and the only thing known is the high card strength of responder. Oftentimes, good fits in suits are missed because of lack of bidding space.
- 3. Jacoby two hearts (double negative bid; i.e. incorporates the further response of three clubs as a negative bid by responder into one convenient bid). The bid of two no trump is used to bid a good heart suit. Again, sounds interesting and this was my preferred response for many years. However, it has the wrong hand playing no trump and uses up too much bidding space.
- 4. Control showing bids (i.e. reflects total number of controls with kings equally one control and aces equally two controls, with step type responses). Again, the major problem with this system is that it takes up bidding space and often times, the number of controls is not as important as a specific control or suit. This is especially true with Roman Key Card Blackwood (or 14-30) systems which can pinpoint specific cards and controls.
