# **BASIC HAND EVALUATION**

Bridge starts off as a simple game. There are four dealt hands, each consisting of 13 cards. Partnerships either play or defend each hand, depending upon the auction. The bidding levels are between one club and seven no trump. Depending upon your dealt hand and bids made by your partner and the opponents, you might decide to pass, bid, or do both. Sounds pretty simple!

In order to convey information to your partner and the opponents, we need to establish some basic guidelines in order to bid. Otherwise, the bids will not have any meaning. Bidding is like a language. Some contracts take very few bids (words) to achieve their goal. Other more complex contracts require additional words (conventional bids) in order to achieve their intended goals. The key to success is to understand the language which your partnership has agreed to speak.

The basic concept of hand evaluation has been utilized for many decades. Players have tried to change various aspects, but generally it has remained the same. This is particularly true regarding the value of high card points (HCP).

### A. Maximum High Card Points (HCP) per suit:

Ace =	4 points
King =	3 points
Queen =	2 points
Jack =	1 point

Total HCP: 10 points x 4 suits = 40 HCPs per hand

The system isn't perfect, but it is quick and efficient. For instance, aces are generally undervalued, whereas jacks are overvalued (i.e. an ace takes a trick most of the time, whereas a stand alone jack will generally only take a trick if it is the thirteenth card to be played in the suit!). Remember, the system of point count is a guideline to ensuring that proper bids and contracts can be achieved. However, points don't take tricks!

### **B.** Distributional Points for Short Suits:

This is one area of evaluation that has changed over the past years. Older methods of evaluation were as follows:

Void	=	3 points
Singleton	=	2 points
Doubleton	=	1 point

The problem with this system was that a void suit was given a value of 3 points when initially valuing the hand to bid.

### HAND EVALUATION cont'd.

If the contract ended up in no trump, this void had no value. The other problem was that voids and singletons are more valuable when playing in a suit (see below).

The newer method of valuing distributional points is as follows:

Void =	5 points
Singleton =	3 points
Doubleton =	1 points
	· · · ·

The major difference is that distributional points are not awarded until after the partnership agrees on a suit. The current method isn't perfect, but is more realistic is assessing the value of a hand to determine the proper level of a given contract.

# C. Distributional Points for Long Suits (referred to as length points):

The method of valuing long suits has remained the same over the past few years, with a few modifications. Suits with more than four cards receive 1 extra point for each

additional card; however, the suit must have two of the top three honors or minimum of KJ10XX.

Suits without two of the top three honors can be revalued if partner supports the suit (i.e. AXXXX would originally have only a value of the ace; however, if partner supports the suit, an extra point can be added for length. The subtle change over the years has been to place more emphasis on suit quality when initially valuing a suit. Older methods added 1 point for each card over four in a suit, regardless of quality.

# D. Learning to Revalue and Devalue the Worth of a Hand:

Listen to the auction. If the left hand opponent (LHO) bids a suit in which you have a stray king or queen, subtract the value of these points from you hand; it is unrealistic to assume you will get a trick with these cards. However, if the right hand opponent (RHO) bids the suit, the king could be given value and maybe even the queen.

Beware of the duplication of values in a specific suit. For instance, during the auction you have determined that your partner has either a void or singleton is a suit in which you hold the ace, king, and queen (9 HCPs). If your partner values his hand as 5 extra points for a void in the same suit, the combined hands have valued this suit as 14 points! Unfortunately, the suit is only worth three tricks.

Remember, tricks are taken by cards, not by points. Games and slams can be achieved with fewer HCPs when distributional points are properly utilized. Also, combined hands of 33 HCPs can easily be defeated if the points are not properly located (i.e. missing the ace and king of the trump suit!).

### Conclusion:

Bidding is not an exact science. However, if partnerships utilize the proper bidding tools, approximately 85% of the proper contracts will be achieved. This is not a bad average considering the multitude of hand combinations within a deck of cards.
