Hand of the Month: ROMAN KEY CARD BLACKWOOD "14-30" CONVENTION

Note to Novices: There are 2 Roman Key Card Blackwood (RKCB) conventions. 1 is RKCB and the other is RKCB "14-30". The difference is in the meaning of the 5C & 5D responses.

This lesson is about RKCB "14-30". Unlike the regular Blackwood convention, it uses <u>five controls</u> in responses. The five controls are the four aces and the king of trump and are bid as follows (after partner bids 4NT asking for controls):

- **5 C** 1 or 4 controls (i.e. 3 aces and the king of trump or 4 aces).
- **5 D** 0 or 3 controls (i.e. no aces or the king of trump or 2 Aces and the king of trump or 3 aces).
- **5 H** 2 or 5 controls without the queen of trump.
- 5 S 2 or 5 controls with the queen of trump.

Note: The **5 C** and **5 D** responses do not reflect the queen of trump, whereas the **5 H** response denies the queen of trump and the **5 S** response reflects the queen of trump. If partner responds either **5C** or **5 D**, the **4NT** bidder can ask for the queen of trumps by bidding the next higher suit, providing the suit is not trumps. For instance, if hearts or spades is trumps, after a **5 C** response, the bid of **5 D** would ask partner to either deny or show the queen of trumps as follows:

- **A**. Rebid of the agreed trump suit at the five level would deny the queen of trumps.
- **B.** Bid of the agreed trump suit at the six level would show the queen of trumps; however, the bid would also deny holding any outside kings.
- **C.** If responder has the queen of trump and an outside king, responder then bids the lowest ranking suit holding the king (i.e. holding the queen of trumps and the king of clubs, responder would bid 6 clubs after the 5 diamond bid of partner; note: this bid would deny holding the king of hearts if spades were trump).
- **D.** Bid 5 NT holding the queen of trump without any outside kings but holding extra values (i.e. maybe 16 points when partner expected you to only have 11 points). This might help partner to determine whether or not a bid of seven is possible.

Using the Blackwood convention, only the four aces are identified after bidding 4 NT (i.e.; 2 clubs, pass, 2 diamonds, pass, 2 hearts, pass, 3 hearts, pass, 4 NT, pass 5 diamonds – reflects one ace), Now, it is not possible for the opener to know whether or not partner has enough strength to bid a slam with the following holding:

Spades: AK
Hearts: QJ10xxxx
Diamonds: KQJ
Clubs: A

Playing "14-30", however, the opener will be able to identify specific cards in partner's suit to either bid or avoid bidding the slam in hearts.

Roman Key Card 1430 cont'd.

After the same auction as mentioned above, the response over 4NT by opener will determine whether or not slam is possible. For instance, 2 clubs, pass, 2 diamonds, pass, 2 hearts, pass, 3 hearts, pass, 4NT, pass, the following bids would help opener to determine the level of the contract:

- **A.** 5 clubs (one control) opener would rebid 5 hearts (to play) knowing that two key control cards are missing.
- **B.** 5 diamonds (zero or three controls) opener would rebid 5 hearts knowing that both the ace and king of trumps and the ace of diamonds are missing or that partner has all of the missing controls! Sounds like contract will be going down one trick or making all of the tricks!). After the 5 heart bid by opener, responder will now correct the bid to 6 hearts when holding three controls and opener will further correct the contract to 7NT realizing that all of the tricks can be claimed!)
- $\textbf{C.}\ 5$ hearts (two controls without the queen of trump) opener will bid 6 hearts, since one of the key controls is missing.

As can be seem from the above examples, the exactness of the contract can be determined when using 14-30, whereas regular Blackwood doesn't have the necessary bidding tools to either bid or not bid the appropriate slam.

Another example would help identify when the queen asking bid is important:

Spades: AK
Hearts: KJ10xxxx
Diamonds: KQJ
Clubs: A

Auction: 2 clubs, pass, 2 diamonds, pass, 2 hearts, pass, 3 hearts,

pass, 4NT, pass:

If responder bids 5 clubs (one control), openerCan ask for the queen of trumps by bidding 5 diamonds. If responder denies the queen by bidding 5 hearts, then opener passes. If responder reflects the queen of hearts by bidding 6 clubs (reflects the queen of trumps and the king of clubs), opener can bid 6 NT realizing the only losing trick will be either the ace of hearts or diamonds. If partner bid 6 hearts, however, after the queen asking auction, opener will pass realizing a club lead would defeat the contract in 6 NT.
