## **DEFENSE AGAINST SUIT CONTRACTS** General Concepts:

The opening lead against suit contracts

A. Choosing the suit (preferably in the following order):

- 1. Partner's suit.
- 2. Your suit strength before length.
- 3. The unbid suits.
- 4. Short suits.
- 5. Long suits.
- 6. Leading trump.
- B. Choosing the card (preferably in the following order):
  - 1. Partner's suit.
  - 2. Top of a doubleton.

  - Top of a two-card or longer sequence.
    Otherwise low (3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> highest, although I recommend 3<sup>rd</sup> highest). 5. DO NOT lead away from an ace.
  - Other suits:
  - 6. Top of a two-card or longer suit.
  - 7. Top of a doubleton.
  - 8. Otherwise low (I recommend  $3^{rd}$  or  $5^{th}$ highest instead of 4<sup>th</sup> highest).

Generally, do not lead away from an ace.

## Comments:

- 1. Leads against suit contracts appear similar to leads against no-trump contracts. However, there are major differences in the approach to a suit contract versus a no- trump contract.
- 2. Listen and learn from the bidding. Learning to visualize your partner's hand and declarer's hand is a major key to a successful defense strategy.
- 3. Generally, favor strong sequences when leading a suit.
- 4. Only lead your suit instead of partner's suit if you feel that it will create a better opportunity to minimize declarer's tricks.
- 5. Leading singletons can sometimes create ruffs for the defense; however, if no ruff happens, these leads Frequently lead to additional tricks for the declarer.
- 6. Leading trump can be very effective, especially if it is the second suit of declarer (i.e. 1 + -P-1 + -P 4¥-P-P-P). With three trump, a trump lead might reduce declarer's ruffing power.

The exception is the lead of a singleton trump (i.e. 1♥)-

P-3♥-P-4♥-P-P-P). If you lead trump, partner may Have the QXX in the trump suit and your lead will finesse Your partner.

## **DEFENSE AGAINST NOTRUMP** CONTRACTS

## General Concepts:

The opening lead against notrump contracts A. Choose the suit (in the following order).

- 1. Partner's suit
- 2. Your suit
- 3. The unbid suit
- 4. Considering the contract

B. Choosing the card

- 1. Partner's suit.
  - a. Top of a doubleton.
  - b. Top of a two-card or longer
  - sequence. c. Otherwise low
- 2. Your long suit or the unbid suit.
  - a. Top of a three-card or longer sequence, an interior sequence,
  - or a broken sequence.
  - b. Low or fourth best.

## Comments:

The advantage of playing disciplined overcalls is that partner is confident about leading the suit. Learn to believe your partner, not the opponents. Undisciplined overcalls generally result in lack of partnership confidence.

Only lead your suit instead of partner's suit if you feel that it will create a better opportunity to minimize declarer's tricks.

Leading the unbid suit can be risky. The fact that it is unbid doesn't mean that the declarer/dummy is without the suit.

Do not lead the unbid suit instead of partner's suit since this suit may be the outside entry to make additional tricks in partner's suit.

Listen and learn from the bidding. Many contracts can be defeated after seeing dummy and remembering what declarer bid. Learning to visualize your partner's hand and declarer's hand is a major key to a successful defense strategy.
